DIOCESE OF EVO WOMEN CELEBRATE MOTHERING SUNDAY IN STYLE!!

... Mama Evo Speaks on Qualities of a Woman that Knows Her God

... Bishop Ordu Prays for All Evo Diocese Women and Their Families

It was a huge celebration today, Sunday, 15 March 2026, as mothers in all the churches in the Diocese of Evo, Anglican Communion, rolled out the drums to mark this year's Mothering Sunday, or Mother's Day.

The President of the Mothers' Union and Women's Guild, wife of the Bishop, Dr. Mrs Chinyere Uchenna Ordu, JP, and her husband, The Rt Rev Innocent Uchechukwu Ordu, DSSRS, JP, worshipped at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Rumuobiokani Deanery, and St Mark's Anglican Church, Elemenwo District, where Mama Evo preached the sermons.

In her sermon at St Mark's, Dr. Mrs. Ordu spoke on the theme of the celebration: "The Woman that Knows Her God Shall Do Exploits", taken from Daniel 11:32.

She listed numerous qualities of a woman who knows her God as follows: "She can't be corrupted; she is strong in her spirit and emotions. She is not a weakling but spiritually vibrant."

Mama Evo continued: "She is bold but not rude; she is respectful and brave but does not look for trouble; she is dependable in her home, Church, and community."

Dr. Mrs. Ordu used the stories of Daniel, Joseph, and Mary to illustrate her teaching.

She also spoke on the meaning of doing exploits: "Being extraordinary, conscientious, always determined for success, to excel and shine."

But the Bishop's wife ended her thoughtful sermon by asking all women: "How much of this God do you know and seek? Knowing Him will make you a force to be reckoned with wherever you are."

Rt Rev Innocent Ordu, the Bishop, rounded off the celebration by praying fervently for all mothers, all the women of the Diocese, and their families.

He prayed that the women would fully know their God and do exploits, and that God would keep them alive to witness next year's Mothering Sunday.

In all the churches in the Diocese, women staged various displays and sang songs that highlighted the essence of womanhood.
